


SYNOPSIS

F.A.M. is a half hour drama about a black blended family trying to live a normal life in the all-white suburb of Atlanta, GA. The story covers the life of Trey, who is trying to balance his relationship with three women: Traci - his ex and the mother of his child, Dara - his new wife, and Olivia - his 15-year-old daughter who is struggling with her sexuality. Trey navigates the challenges of having a child coming out in a subculture of homophobia and co-parenting with a woman hellbent on destroying his marriage.

Creator/Executive Producer, Anthony E. Williams - Trey

Anthony E. Williams began his acting career in NYC after earning his MBA and having a successful career in corporate America. Following the lead role in the film Astray, he began executive producing films. After two features and a short film, Anthony founded WMZ Entertainment as the CEO. The first project of WMZ Entertainment is F.A.M. which is is the first TV Pilot written by Anthony. F.A.M. has won 'Best in Georgia" at the Southern Shorts Awards and Anthony won 'Best Actor' in his role as Trey. As an actor he is known for several other projects such as 'Honey Rise Up and Dance' - *Universal* and 'Step Up' - *Lionsgate*.



DIRECTOR, Kyle Romanek

Emmy Award Winning Cinematographer, Kyle Romanek, is a film director, cinematographer and writer. In 2017 he won an Emmy for Cinematography for a short film featured on the Oprah Winfrey Network. Kyle has been making films since he was nine years old and his passion for film continued to grow while attending Full Sail University's film production program. Immediately after graduation Kyle was accepted into the Creative Minds Filmmaking Institute at the Cannes Film Festival. Soon after Romanek would camera assist on reality and scripted television on the East Coast for shows airing on Travel Channel, Lifetime and TLC. Inspired and motivated, Kyle set out to direct his first feature film based on a script of his own writing, "Astray". In the fall of 2016, Kyle co-hosted a panel at San Francisco Comic-Con about world building in low budget cinema focusing on his second feature film titled "Arg Stairs" which was released in 2017. In addition, Kyle directed two short documentaries in 2017: "Ditch the Van" and "Mariel Cota" and is currently in production on a documentary titled "Simone" alongside Mallory Cunningham.



Producer, Mallory Cunningham

Emmy Award Winning Producer and Cinematographer, Mallory Cunningham, has always been drawn to all aspects of creating films and storytelling. Mallory grew up in Kentucky, picked up a camera at a young age and began making films with friends. While earning a degree in Telecommunications and Business at the University of Kentucky, she diversified her skills by filming for the athletic department. Mallory then relocated to California and began working alongside filmmaker John Chester to create short films for the Oprah Winfrey Network. During that time she fulfilled many roles on their small film team including, producing, assistant editing, camera operating, story collaboration, and more. In 2016, Mallory won her first Emmy for producing "Saving Emma", a short film featured on OWN. In 2017, she won a second Emmy for producing and an additional Emmy for cinematography for the short film, "Worry for Maggie". In 2017, Mallory co-directed and produced shorts "Ditch the Van" and "Mariel Cota". "Ditch the Van" won "The New Normal Award" at Mountainfilm Telluride. Currently she is in production on a documentary titled "Simone" alongside Kyle Romanek.



Producer, Sean Morse-Barry

Sean Morse-Barry is a writer and producer known for his work on the feature films, Arg Stairs, and Astray. He has also served as a staff writer for the Second City Produced variety show, "after Dark with Julian Clark". His work as a freelance writer and producer in the online space for popular channel, "I Want My Lauren", "Girl Pants Productions" and "Funny or Die Community" has garnered over one-million combined views and a Huffington Post share for the sketch "How Climate Change Deniers Sound to Normal People"







Acacia Leigh as Olivia (Trey's daughter)

Acacia Leigh is an actress born and raised in Cleveland, Ohio. Acacia graduated from Ohio Dominican University in 2014 with a BA in psychology and communications. After moving to Atlanta, GA to pursue her acting career she decided to travel to Los Angeles where she attended the Groundlings, and studied Meisner at the Baron/Brown Studio. Acacia has won 'Best Actress' at the Southern Shorts Awards for her role as Olivia and is known for projects such as "The Quad" and "Fatal Attraction"

Breana Cymone as *Traci (Trey's Ex)*

Breana Cymone is an Atlanta Actress who holds a BA of Fine Arts from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. She appeared on several shows such as Sleepy Hollow, Survivor's Remorse, and Greenleaf.

Candace West, was born and raised in Atlanta, GA and found her passion for acting in theatre throughout grade school. After playing soccer at Vanderbilt University and professionally, she has returned to her love of acting. He also had roles in the major Motion Pictures "Barbershop 3" and upcoming films such as Tyler Perry's "Acrimony", "The Hate You Give" and "Night School" with Kevin Hart..
